Formative study findings and 'Healthy City' CPHC intervention model shared with Mysuru City Corporation (MCC)

The CPHC team shared the findings of a formative research study with Mr Lakshmikant Reddy, IAS, Commissioner of Mysuru City Corporation and Dr Nagraju, the Chief Health Officer, Mysuru City Corporation, and Dr Mahadeva Prasad, District Surveillance Officer, Health and Family Welfare on December 28. The formative research study was conducted in Mysuru city to understand the current status of comprehensive primary healthcare, identify and analyse barriers and facilitators to comprehensive primary healthcare, and develop design options to strengthen urban primary healthcare.

The "Healthy City" CPHC intervention model including the intervention framework and key action points developed based on the study findings was also shared with the officials. Based on the inputs from MCC, KHPT will develop a proposal for the implementation of the "Mysuru healthy city model" and mobilize resources for project implementation. The Commissioner
